Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian Curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, parent contributions continue to provide an important and critical source of funding which enables us to supply resources necessary to maximise successful delivery of our learning programs. The ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through paying the voluntary contributions, fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Within our school your financial contribution has allowed us to replenish or upgrade materials to support our curriculum and enhance our quality teaching and learning program. This has included purchasing and maintaining:

- books and resources for teaching reading and writing,
- literature for classroom libraries and class book clubs,
- hands on materials for teaching mathematics.
- games such as chess sets and other maths or problem-solving resources,
- sports equipment for the PE and Sports program and lunchtime activities,
- art resources for the Arts program as well as classroom program,
- classroom furniture and organisational resources (tubs for books and other class resources),
- wellbeing learning opportunities such as resources for mindfulness and the Zones of Regulation,

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions



Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Reading Eggs activities will be set each week to complement the literacy curriculum program at school. <u>Mathletics</u>: (Years 3-6) Mathletics supports students with their numeracy skills and knowledge through fun and engaging activities that motivate students to continue practising both in class and at home. Mathletics home learning activities will be set each week to complement the numeracy curriculum program at school. <u>PM eCollection</u>: (F - Yr 2) The PM eCollection is a digital library of books specifically designed to support the teaching of reading. This subscription is used as part of guided reading instruction at school as well as student individual practice in the class and at home. <u>Story Box Library (F-6)</u>: Story Box Library is a subscription-based educational website, created for children to view stories by local authors and illustrators, being read aloud by fantastic, predominantly Australian and New Zealand, storytellers. This subscription is used to support classroom learning as well as engaging students and families with literature and reading outside of school hours. 	\$30 (F-2) \$17 (3-6)
ICT Contribution: this voluntary contribution will greatly assist with the purchase and maintenance of devices and software/applications used by students in the classroom. This includes netbooks, iPads and network devices and the software that students use on these devices.	\$50

<u>eConnect Netbook Program:</u> The eConnect program is a non-compulsory 1:1 mobile device program for all students in Years 3-6. Families can choose from four carefully recommended units which can be purchased via an online portal through the DET accredited supplier Learning with Technologies (LWT): Parents can access the eConnect Portal to purchase these units at:

http://MooneePondsPS.orderportal.com.au. All device specifications, insurance and warranty information is located on the portal. Devices can be purchased outright or financed. Once purchased, units are delivered to the school and configured to MPPS specifications.

Financial Support for Families

Moonee Ponds Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) Parents holding a valid means-tested concession card
 will be eligible to apply. A special consideration category will also exist. Eligible families will need to
 apply for the CSEF at the school office with applications to be entered by school administrators onto
 a web-based system. A payment of \$125 for primary school students (\$225 for secondary school
 students) will be paid directly to the school to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs for
 the benefit of the student.
- <u>State Schools Relief Fund (SSRF)</u> SSRF may cover the cost of new uniforms, shoes, books and more for disadvantaged students. For access to this resource, please speak with the Principal, Matthew Bott. https://stateschoolsrelief.org.au/
- <u>Payment Plans</u> The school has payment plans for parents to access if needed. Any questions regarding financial assistance or other issues please see the Principal/Assistant Principal.
