These new standards reflect the national curriculum and it is mandated that Victorian schools use these standards for assessment in English and Mathematics this year.

All staff meetings have been dedicated to professional learning in the new curriculum and standards as well as many hours in grade teams and individually. This work will continue across the next few weeks including the student free (curriculum) day on Monday May 27th to ensure our reports accurately reflect the standards.

I would like to acknowledge the professional way our teachers have approached this work since the lifting of the work bans. They have moderated student work samples to ensure we have a collective understanding of the standards and that our collective judgements are accurate.

Library News

Our sophisticated students already knew how to ask someone to search the computer for a title, or an author, or a subject. Many were even trained in borrowing processes. Thanks to Vicki and Kim and Vincent, all will be celebrating the news that the stand alone computers now have the library files installed. This means that our students can now independently search and find a book in the Library for themselves. In recent weeks six Moonee Ponds Primary School students joined nearly 2000 students representing over 190 schools from across Australia in providing advice to the government on a range of priority topics.

Established in 2009, under the Australian Government's Cybersafety Plan, the Youth Advisory Group on Cybersafety (YAG) allows young Australians aged 8-17 to provide advice to the federal government on cybersafety issues.

The students were able to provide advice directly to government via the secure YAG online consultation website and may have the opportunity to attend face-to-face forums later this year. They took part in discussions on a range of cybersafety topics including digital citizenship, cyberbullying, mobile phone safety, privacy, social networking sites and online computer games. They were also able to generate their own discussion topics. Angus Kelly, in grade 5, took advantage of this feature by creating the thread, "Why do people go on social network sites when they know there is a risk?"

Advice from previous years has led to the development of several government cybersafety resources including the Cybersafety Help Button and the Easy Guide to Socialising Online. The Help Button provides internet users, particularly children and young people, with easy online access to counselling, reporting and information resources to assist in

dealing with cybersafety issues. The *Easy Guide* provides cybersafety information about 27 different social networking sites, search engines and online games. This includes general tips on how to stay safe when using any social media site.

Following advice from YAG members the government has also established the Teachers and Parents Advisory Group on Cybersafety (TAP). Parents

NEWS FROM MOONEE VALLEY COUNCIL

We're looking for people from all over Moonee Valley to provide comments on walking, cycling, road safety and other transport projects and help us develop good strategies to make it easier to get around Moonee Valley and become less reliant on cars.

The Integrated Transport Committee provides a forum to engage with and obtain feedback from key stakeholders in the delivery of Moonee Valley's Integrated Transport Plan, Walking and Cycling Strategy, Municipal Parking Strategy and Road Safety Plan (including Better Moves Around Schools) and assist in the development of other relevant Council strategies.

Our meetings are held from 6 to 8 pm on Mondays at the Civic Centre, Moonee Ponds. Proposed dates are 17 June, 12 August, 21 October and 2 December 2013. We typically have a short presentation on a current project, updates on strategic issues and current projects. In addition if you are interested you might participate in a safety audit of a shared path or visit to a location in your neighbourhood where a project is planned.

You are not expected to know all the strategies but may wish to have a look at them on Moonee Valley's website.


